

### Nutty Chocolate Caramel Bars

## Here is the recipe for the chocolate caramel bars served at the July meeting:

Makes 2 1/2 dozen bars

- 2 1/3 cups all-purpose flour, divided
- 2 cups old fashioned oats
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon salt

1

- 1 cup (2 sticks) butter or margarine, melted
- 2 cups (12-ounce package), semi-sweet chocolate morsels
- 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cups chopped walnuts
  - cup (12.25-ounce jar) caramel ice cream topping

Combine 2 cups flour, oats, brown sugar, baking soda and salt in large bowl. Add butter; stir until all ingredients are moistened. Reserve 1 cup crumb mixture; press remaining mixture into bottom of ungreased 13" x 9" baking pan.

Bake at 350° F for 15 minutes or until lightly browned. Remove from oven; sprinkle with morsels and walnuts. Combine caramel topping and remaining 1/3 cup flour in small bowl; drizzle over base. Sprinkle with reserved crumb mixture.

Bake at 350° F. for 20 to 25 minutes more or until lightly browned. Cool in pan.
