Exhibitor Standard Submitted by Kari Hill

CHARACTERISTICS

A pleasant intelligent person, helpful, considerate, attentive and of a sporting demeanor. Always willing to give advice and assistance to newcomers, or to others needing it. Attentive to the needs of the dogs being handled, and present each dog to its best advantage.

GENERAL APPEARANCE

A neat, smart, fit looking individual, well groomed, well shod, and well equipped, who moves freely both in and out of the ring.

TEMPERAMENT

Calm, confident, unhurried, and friendly.

HEAD

Neither big nor pin headed.

Skull broad, to allow for plenty of brainpower. Expression pleasant and smiling, regardless of judges' decisions, other exhibitors' actions, and the dog's behavior. Nose small so as to not be stuck into where it is not wanted.

EYES

Sharp and bright. Observant of other exhibitor's location, judge's hand signals and the movement and position of all dogs in the ring.

MOUTH

Usually best kept closed except to briefly answer judge's questions or to congratulate successful exhibitors.

Teeth clean, white, and presented in a smiling fashion at all times.

NECK

Long enough to hold the head up proudly and flexible enough to turn the head as to observe everything that is happening in the ring. Should never be stuck out.

FOREQUARTERS

Shoulders broad and able to shrug off unsporting comments from other exhibitors.

Arms of sufficient length and strength to extend a handshake

to the winners, keep a firm hold on the dog, collect any prize cards, and give a friendly pat to the dog all at the same time.

BODY

Sufficiently slim as to not impede other exhibitors leaving the ring and to not completely block the judge's view of all the dogs behind.

HINDQUARTERS

Well developed and strong so as to be able to move the dog in the ring at its optimum speed.

FEET

Firmly on the ground as this is only a sport after all. To be kept out of the mouth at all times.

GAIT

Free moving and graceful, moving in harmony with the dog's speed.

COAT

Dress should be neat, clean and tidy, neither flamboyant nor immodest, but designed to allow free movement without distraction to any dog in the ring. Feet should be well shod in practical shoes to allow for easy movement.

COLOR

Should be chosen to complement the color of the dog, or if several different colored dogs are being handled, to at least not completely hide the outline of any dog, e.g. Wearing a long black skirt when showing a black dog.

SIZE

Exhibitors may come in all sizes and shapes, the only limitation being ability to do justice to the dog when in the ring.

MAJOR FAULTS

Dirty or scruffy appearance, grumpy, vicious or flustered temperament; swollen head; loud mouth, especially when used for insulting comments or bad language; unsporting behavior; unkempt dress.

Chairman's Report November 2010

- Meet the Breeds Wows Record Crowds at Javits --

New York, NY– Last month the American Kennel Club and Cat Fanciers' Association hosted the second edition of Meet the Breeds presented by Pet Partners, Inc., Your Partner in Pet Healthcare. Attended by more than 39,000 people in the tri-state area, the world's largest showcase of dogs and cats was a resounding success, with participation from 200 dog and cat breed booths, more than 100 vendors and 21 sponsors.

Our breed clubs outdid themselves with booths decorated to depict the history and characteristics of each breed. Congratulations to the Pembroke Welsh Corgi Club of America and their "Queen Elizabeth" for winning Best Booth in Show award. As the focal point of Meet the Breeds, the breed booths showcased the diversity of AKC dogs and drove home the importance of doing your research before adding a pet to the family.

In addition to the breeds, attendees were also introduced to other aspects of the dog and cat world through fun games and giveaways for kids; demonstrations that included dog and cat agility, flyball and a Cat Fashion Show; and vendors selling unique dog and cat items. We also held the local presentations for three of the 2010 AKC Humane Fund Awards for Canine Excellence (ACE) recipients - "Wyatt" (Service Dog), "Rufus" (Therapy Dog) and "Cassius" (Search and Rescue) - in the demo ring for thousands to enjoy.

The extensive media coverage that Meet the Breeds received emphasizes the appeal of its hands-on, family-friendly format and focus on responsible dog ownership. Articles appeared in newspapers from New York to Los Angeles and Calgary to Orlando, in national outlets like *Fox & Friends* and the *New York Times*, and on early morning TV segments during the event itself. In all, we reached hundreds of millions via media, highlighting the wonderful world of purebred dogs and cats.

Meet the Breeds was a team effort and a number of people deserve thanks.

Dennis Sprung's vision helped this event grow in its second year, solidifying its place as one of the world's greatest showcases. Michael Canalizo handled venue logistics and facilitated our move into a larger space, while Gina DiNardo coordinated breed club and staff participation and served as spokesperson during our media appearances. AKC staff from both the New York and Raleigh offices ran the event by manning the ticket booths, assisting breed club volunteers, answering questions from the public, organizing vendors, emceeing the demo ring and greeting kids as Bailey the Beagle. Thank you.

Our biggest thanks go out to our breed clubs. Without your support, this event would not even be a possibility. Your patience, dedication and creativity in greeting the public and providing an experience for them like no other underscores the commitment you show every day to your breed and the sport of purebred dogs. Our thanks go as well to the stars of the show – the dogs – that endured and enjoyed thousands of pets, hugs, kisses and photo sessions, all to help us promote the love of purebred dogs. Thank you for your participation, and we hope to see all of you next year.
