I hope this holiday season is finding each and every one you, and your families, well. It is a time joy, laughter and celebration as well as spending time with those near and dear.





I was appointed me to represent dog owners in the preparation of animal ordinances for Gwinnett County GA. I was honored as Atlanta Kennel Club "Member of the year" in 1998.

1998 – 2012 my job responsibilities prevented me from actively participating in a local Kennel club.

2012- present. I was active in the creation and presentation of the Norwegian Elkhound Association of America award winning "Meet the Breeds" booth at AKC sponsored events. This award is presented to persons whose work and efforts are deemed by the Association to have been of outstanding quality and benefit to the Norwegian Elkhound Breed.
