

1984-1994 as a member of Norwegian Elkhound Association of the Potomac Valley I was a board member, President, and Regional Show Chairman. In 1994 my job took us to Atlanta, GA

1994-1998 we became active with the all-breed Atlanta Kennel Club. I served on the board and was Vice President of the Club until my job moved us to South Carolina. Our family coordinated and taught handling classes for the Atlanta Club, and I was Santa for pictures with Santa. I was appointed me to represent dog owners in the preparation of animal ordinances for Gwinnett County GA. I was honored as Atlanta Kennel Club "Member of the year" in 1998.

1998 – 2012 my job responsibilities prevented me from actively participating in a local Kennel club.

2012- present. I was active in the creation and presentation of the Norwegian Elkhound Association of America award winning "Meet the Breeds" booth at AKC sponsored events. As a result of these efforts we were the recipients of the "A. Wells & Catherine S. Peck Award". This award is presented to persons whose work and efforts are deemed by the Association to have been of outstanding quality and benefit to the Norwegian Elkhound Breed.

I have also served as web coordinator and Show Coordinator for the NEAA and was honored with "the Ed Schlesinger Outstanding Service Award", to the person whose work and efforts are deemed by the Association to have been of outstanding quality and benefit to the Association.

As an active member of the Greenville Kennel Club since 2012, I have served on the nominating committee, as well as Match Chair, President, RV parking chair, Newsletter editor, and volunteered at most club events.

In 2015 the nominating committee asked me to serve as President for the 2015-2016 club year. I expressed my reluctance to the nominating committee that our upcoming retirement may conflict with the duties of GKC President. 
